Driscoll will speak on his organization’s vision for AI in post-acute care to connect patients, healthcare providers, and caregivers outside of a hospital’s four walls. According to the Institute of Medicine, failures in post-acute care drive 73% of unwarranted variation in Medicare spend.

“We’re spending too much for patients *not* to get better,” says Driscoll. “Technology, and particularly AI, is a force multiplier for health care. CareCentrix is using machine learning, as well as pattern recognition and modeling, to help patients safely age and heal where they want to be - at home.”

According to CareCentrix data, 69% of patients leaving the hospital have a new prescription at the time of discharge, but just above half of those on a new medication understand the potential side effects. Nearly a quarter of discharged patients are suffering from depression, and 25% don't have a follow-up appointment with their doctor. By leveraging AI and machine learning, CareCentrix can help reduce the risk that these statistics translate into dangerous gaps in care after a hospital stay.
